## **Code of Conduct - Publication rules -**

1. The usual guidelines (Vancouver and ICJME) are applicable
2. All participants (mentees) to a project who complete the Pancreas 2000 course shall become co-authors on all publications resulting from the project
3. The first author must not be a mentor
4. The first and last authorship positions may be shared
5. All project results will be published by the entire group. No parts of the group shall publish "their" results separately or in advance
6. Part of the group must not obstruct the publications from the project
7. It is desirable to initiate a discussion about the role of all members of a project group early during the project
8. Researchers from outside the Pancreas 2000 class (e.g. from centers sending mentees or mentors) may become co-authors only if approved by the project group in advance
9. In accordance with the rules in large consortia, authorship should reflect the contribution to a study but priority for authorship will be for Pancreas 2000 participants
10. Discussion points will be handled by the entire group of mentors
11. Recognition to be given to Pancreas 2000
